
Dallas Cup has fostered relationships with top governing bodies and leagues in the sport, enabling the tournament to host the most high-profile clubs from across the globe.

#### Referees

Partnerships with referee academies from across the globe give the Dallas Cup its international reputation of having the best officiating of any youth soccer tournament in the world.

Through the years, over 20 referees with FIFA World Cup experience have officiated in the Dallas Cup, among them 1990 and 2010 World Cup final referees Edgardo Codesal (Mexico) and Howard Webb (England), respectively.

## Homestay Program:

Requirements



Criminal Background Checks for all people 18 and older



If a team is unable to make trip and withdraws, local team will be responsible for 80 volunteer hours

# Homestay Program: Communication with International Team

- HomeStay coordinator to contact team to establish communication
- Make arrangements for meeting team at airport, coordinate with coach
- > Team arrival and departure dates
  - Arrival on Friday or Saturday (3/22 or 3/23)
  - Departure on Monday, April 1

## Homestay Program:

### Tickets/Passes/Activities

- Homestay teams will receive 110 tickets for opening day at the Cotton Bowl
- Local players and coaches will receive passes
- HomeStay families can entertain, but please check with coaches first

## Homestay Program – Packet Contents

### Homestay Family Responsibilities

- > Transportation to and from daily meeting point
- > After group play, teams may move hotels, be aware
- > Teams will be responsible for transporting players to and from games and events
- > You are responsible for assisting with the transportation to and from the team's point of arrival (i.e. assist with picking up teams vans)

# Homestay Program – Packet Contents Necessary Paperwork

- All necessary paperwork for each Homestay team hosting will be emailed
  - Sample Letter
  - Homestay Contract must be distributed to all Homestay families
  - Medical/Liability Release
    - Available after coach/manager meeting (3/20)
    - Please give a copy to each host family

## **Homestay Program – Packet Contents**

### **Airport Protocol**

- > Confirm flight arrival times, terminal and gate
- > Arrive at least 30 minutes prior to team's arrival
- > Determine transportation needs in advance (People and luggage)
- Confirm coach's hotel and give directions if needed

### **Homestay Program - Packet Contents**

### **Homestay Pairings**

Obtain all contact information for coaches, including correct hotel room numbers

- Please complete HomeStay Pairings form & send copies to:
  - Primary Contact
  - Coach
  - Frances Ortiz-Solares (DC staff)

## **Homestay Program - Packet Contents**

### Injuries/Illnesses

- Notify primary contact or coach first (if not possible, give notice after treatment is obtained)
- If reasonably possible, take player to a Baylor hospital
- If Baylor is not an option, closest emergency facility
- Parents/Guardians of players have agreed to be financially responsible for all medical expenses incurred, host family shall not be responsible nor liable for any cost of medical treatment

## Homestay Program – Packet Contents Helpful Hints

- > Arrange daily pickup and drop off times in advance
- > DO NOT allow players to drive any of your cars
- > Try to plan a team activity
- Do not overthink meals simplicity
- ➤ Involve all members of your team, not just those housing players it will help share the fun and financial responsibility
- Long Distance phone calls
- > No Uber or Lyft
- > No hotel or non team families or other teams
- > Use Dallas Cup address if anyone asks for local address:
